1.1 General Update

- All five food and beverage pitches have now been let for the season.
- Some 'facelift' work was carried out at Queen's Drive from existing (2023/24)
 budget this was mainly the parasols over the tables and potentially some repairs to the seating.
- The Events Space was marketed in January by our colleagues in Streetscene in the hope of attracting a reliable operator – we received one proposal that was suitable who was aiming [at the time of writing] to start operations by the 2nd May Bank Holiday
- Council staff have agreed to work with the traders to try to put together a launch
 day for the season and also to facilitate entertainment in the trader's area (around
 the food pitches).
- At the time of writing the Events Team had received proposals for 24 events to take place in the traders area on Queens Drive which we hope will provide a much needed boost.
