

### **Conditions - as offered by the applicant within the Operating Schedule of the Application Form**

Hawkwind are a rock band celebrating their 52nd anniversary, and also the band founders eightieth birthday, in August this year. The event is known as Hawkfest and is primarily held for Hawkwind Fan Club members. It is a family orientated weekend. Tickets are sold privately in advance. We hope to sell approximately 1000 tickets, although previous events have never reached that capacity. Children twelve and under are free. The largest percentage of our guests is in the age range 50 to 70+. The remainder of our guests are from babies upwards.

Hawkwind hold this type of event regularly at various locations, and have had no complaints from the Police, Council or Local Residents. The fans enjoy meeting each other and meeting the band. They are entertained by Hawkwind and other bands. We provide music workshops and childrens' activities. The fans will be in tents, campervans and caravans.

We intend to promote all of the licensing objectives, and due to the age profile and nature of our guests, we do not foresee any problems in doing so.

Having run these events before, we know our guests and we have never experienced any crime or disorder. We have adequate stewards on site to deal with most situations that could arise.

Key stewards are in contact with each other and the gate.

Hawkfest wristbands will be affixed at the gate upon entry. In the event of any unauthorised access, anyone without a wristband will not be allowed to buy alcohol, and will be escorted to the gate by stewards.

In the unlikely event of any serious situation arising, we would immediately contact the local police for assistance.

All of the bar staff will be aware of their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003.

The event will be run in accordance with the Health and Safety Executive HSG195 Event Safety Guide (Chapter 28 – Small Events).

There will be adequate stewards and marshalling on site.

There will be and adequate toilets and clean water.

There will be separate and non-public toilets provided for catering units.

All catering personnel will have the relevant food hygiene certificates.

Adequate site lighting will be provided.

All fire lanes will be strictly maintained.

There will be full access to the site for emergency services.

There will be designated separate areas for campervans, caravans and tents.

## APPENDIX C

There will be no vehicle movement in the camping area once parked.

All guests arriving on site will immediately be directed to a holding area off the public highway.

Entry to, and exit from the site for guests, will be from an entrance with good visibility in both directions.

Separate entrance to, and exit from the site for crew, band and site vehicles.

Access to the campsite will be allowed from 12.00 noon on Thursday 26th August, to spread arrival times and avoid any possibility of congestion.

Sound levels and timings agreed with the council will be maintained at all times.

Sound levels will be measured at nearby sensitive premises.

Due to the nature of the event the majority of guests will arrive on Friday 27th August and leave on Monday 30th August, with the exception that some guests will leave the site during the day to use the local shops and facilities. We do not therefore foresee any late night disturbance to local residents.

The premises will comply with Health and Safety guidelines and be suitable for children at all times.

Children will be protected from harm because they will be with their parents.

There will be no unaccompanied children.

A designated children's' play area will be provided adjacent to the main structures, and, due to the location of the site, be well away from the main road.

In line with Challenge 21, all bar staff will be instructed to challenge anyone who looks underage to show proof of age (although we have never had a problem with under-age drinking in the past).
