Scope of work for scrutiny:

Broad topic area:	Use of glyphosate based herbicide on Council owned or controlled land.
Specific areas to	Proposed review
explore within topic area:	Councillor Mike Goodman has submitted the following proposal for a review by the Committee:
	In 2022 it was decided that EDDC would not use glyphosate-based herbicide on council owned land. Many areas particularly verges and pavements are being damaged because the weeds are not being dealt with. This is causing serious damage to pavements and verges.
	Councils in the UK have started to review this policy: it is timely that EDDC review its policy, and any changes should be considered based on current facts.
	Background information
	 In March 2022 Cabinet approved the ban of glyphosate based herbicides by September 2022 as set out in the report recommendation section along with banning the use of woody weed killers; endorsed the replacement of glyphosate and other chemicals with an integrated weed management approach which included the use of the RHS vinegar based weed control and manual control methods; and endorsed bids being placed in the 2023/24 capital programme for 2 x Hotfoam machines (circa £67k investment), required to supplement other integrated weed control methods.

	The report to Cabinet also contained the following reasons for the recommendations: One of Streetscene's objectives this year, and included as part of its service plan (April 2021 – March 2022), was to undertake a review of chemical usage across our service, specifically herbicides that are used across the public

realm and in our green spaces.
 Streetscene Service Plan [2021-22] Objective 5 – Review of chemical usage Investigate and trial more sustainable alternatives to herbicides for weed control. Reduce the use of glyphosate and other chemicals across sports pitches, green spaces and public realm areas. Produce a report to Cabinet on alternatives – to include withdrawing from weed spraying in some areas, including Highways around town centres, which we do although it is not in our remit. Cost physical alternatives and project resourcing requirements. Note: The Committee may wish to focus the review on the above service plan objectives.

Devon County Council is responsible for highways and verges.
Cllr Goodman has requested that Scrutiny Committee considers the effects the ban is having in East Devon, and to consider if a more targeted approach in using glyphosate-based herbicide is more appropriate.
