The applicant is requesting Live and Recorded music outside of the premises from 1200hrs to 0000hrs on Friday 30th August and from 1200hrs to 0000hrs on Saturday 31st August 2019 and there are insufficient safeguards in place to prevent a noise nuisance.

Environmental Health received noise complaints from the previous events at this location on 2018. The EMP states under Appendix B section 4 - Sound levels and Sound Checks. That there shall not be any decibel readings taken during the event and the sound levels shall be under the control of and event director. This type of monitoring is not acceptable for this event, therefore, I am objecting to this event on the grounds of insufficient safeguards to prevent public nuisance.

Local residents have young children they will be unable to get to sleep for the noise, if the event is on until midnight.

Elderly residents will also suffer noise disturbance, many for health reasons retire early.

The farm is close to many residential roads, and the properties in the surrounding roads will have to endure 12 hrs of music on both days, if the event is not made to finish at a more reasonable time.

Concerns over parking in the nearby roads and vandalism to residents' cars and property. People trespassing on property late at night.

Other events such as Exmouth Festival, events on the Recreation Ground Exmouth, even Powderham Castle finish by 10.30pm, 11.00pm at the very latest.

The farm is surrounded by residential roads and is not in an isolated position down some small country lane. It would appear The National Trust, who own the farm do not wish to be 'Good Neighbours' and stop this festival, which causes much upset and distress to local residents, of which many are elderly and have health issues. The National Trust has received complaints about this festival and other events held at the farm, but appear to take no notice.

The residents of the surrounding area to the farm would ask the licensing committee to re think this application. There are many festivals in and around the Exmouth area which could accommodate this festival.
